Appendix 1.1: Publication History: The Loves of the Plants and The Botanic Garden

There is no extant manuscript material for *LOTP*. The work comes to us solely in print editions.

From its first publication, the full title of *LOTP* was *The Botanic Garden, Part II. Containing The Loves of the Plants, a Poem. With Philosophical Notes. Volume the Second.* It was designated "Part II" and "Volume the Second" even though Part I was not yet published. The first edition of *The Botanic Garden, Part I: Containing The Economy of Vegetation. A Poem. With Philosophical Notes* is dated 1791 on its title page, but it did not appear until June 1792 (King-Hele, *Life* pp. 252–53). Numbering the editions is confusing since three editions of Part II (1789, 1790, 1791) were published before the first edition of Part I.

Starting with the first appearance of *The Economy of Vegetation*, the two parts of *The Botanic Garden* were published more or less in tandem with each other, the authoritative lifetime editions of *The Economy of Vegetation* being 1791 (2 editions, both dated 1791 but appearing in 1792), 1795, and 1799. Since the 1799 editions were the only ones printed in octavo, they go together more clearly, though they tended to be bound in separate volumes. The tandem editions in quarto were not always paired with each other, but often bound together rather randomly. For example, the 1790 *LOTP* presented in facsimile in this edition is bound with a 1791 *Economy of Vegetation*, with a collective title page dated 1791. Another copy of *The Botanic Garden*, also held at the McMaster University Mills Memorial Library, has a collective title page with the date 1791, the title page of *The Economy of Vegetation* 1791, and the title page of *LOTP* 1794. The 1789 copy of *LOTP* at the British Library is bound with a 1791 *Economy of Vegetation*.

Changes to the front matter as a result of Part I being published include a collective title page for *The Botanic Garden; A Poem, in Two Parts. Part I. Containing The Economy of Vegetation.*Part II. The Loves of the Plants. With Philosophical Notes; revision of the "Advertisement"; and inclusion of an "Apology." Additionally, the commendatory verses on *The Botanic Garden*, first included in 1791, consistently appear before Part I.
